The weather was perfect for the Fall Farm Day on September 24th.

Over 200 people visited us that day.

We will have both spring and fall farm days again next year.

## Gail fell from a stepladder while painting windows on Wednesday, October 5<sup>th</sup>.

She broke her neck very severely and has spent the eight days since in the ICU and OR.

She will be fine.

Everyone from the first responders to the Neurosurgeon has done a wonderful job for her.

She will not have any neurological deficit.

Tonight, she ate a good dinner and then we took a long walk down the hospital hallways.

Gail cannot speak because of a trach tube but that should come out in a couple days. She will be able to go home shortly thereafter.

The fall did extensive damage to the structure of her neck, however.

A plate, three long rods and over a dozen screws were permanently implanted in order to rebuild her neck.

Her neck will be relatively stiff, but that should be her only permanent result.

Tonight she was moved to a normal hospital room.

She will probably be home in a few days and fully recovered before Christmas.

## Fall harvest is progressing as scheduled.

From a business standpoint the only effect you may notice from this could be poorer than normal customer service on my part.

By that I mean I may be a little slow to respond to messages and it may take a little longer to schedule deliveries.
