Dear Friends, Neighbors and Customers

Grass is growing and that is a very good thing.

The little pigs are doing quite well.

You may recall that we got 150, well 151 actually almost a month ago.

Seventeen went to Ryan and Ashley's, Five Straw Farm.

Two are at Sarah and Jordan's. Those pigs will spend the summer preparing a new garden patch.

Each year Jordan fences a small sod pasture and by fall that ground has been turned a thousand times.

The following spring, that soil is mellow, nutrient rich (think about that) and sod free.

Several more went to other small farmers.

The remaining piglets, about 120, are now divided into four groups, each in their own pasture.

The chickens are doing well.

There are about 160 here in our brooder and the same number at Ryan's.

They grow amazingly fast, especially the white Cornish.

The first group will be ready for harvest in June to coincide with your June ground beef orders.

Each year we harvest more bison than our small cow herd produces.

To supplement our own calf crop, we buy young animals from other farmers.

Last week Gail and I drove to Caledonia to bring home eight claves and yearlings.

Caledonia is in the south eastern corner of Minnesota.

That tip of the state is called the "Drift less Region" because the glaciers that shaped the topography of our state missed it.

It is an ancient area of beautiful hills, bluffs and valleys.

This week we drove to Fairmont, near Iowa to purchase five more.

Those animals give us enough to fill your orders this fall and next.

Our bison cows have produced three healthy, rambunctious calves in the past two weeks.

I posted a photo with text on Facebook. I have attached that article to this letter.

Gail and I spend Friday through Sunday in Rice Lake Wisconsin at the Minnesota Bison Conference.

The conference focused on grass land and savanna resoration.

It was superb.

As always, I learned much. Many of the sessions validated what we do here.

I wrote a short article for the National Bison Association newsletter.

I have attached that also.

Earlier in April, I posted two other photo articles on facebook.

You may be interested in those. One is about an early emerging snapping turtle the other is about trumpeter swans.

Since the posting, two pairs of swans are now nesting in a pond on Sarah and Jordan's Sand Hill Farm.

I wonder how many children are so blessed as Saul and Hazel, to have swans outside their front window?
