Oak Savanna Liberation

These photos and text provide an update on savanna restoration work that we started in earnest three years ago.

I gave this update in the form of a Power Point presentation during a segment on Silvopasture at the Green Lands Blue Water Conference at the University of Minnesota on November 19.

The first photo is of liberated savanna. At Snake River Farm liberating or restoring oak savannas is a multi-step, multi-year process. It begins by locating and identifying open-grown white oaks that are now smothering in a stand of weedy trees and bushes. Those oak trees typically spent their first 25 to 100 years growing without restricting competition.
